Vocabulary	Meaning
Emergency	A situation in which a risk to health, life, property or environment is about to happen.
Accident	Something that happens by chance or from unknown causes and that often causes injury or damage.
Rescue	An act of freeing someone or something from danger.
Injury	Damage or wrong that causes physical or mental pain or hardship.
Crime	An act done by a person which is against the laws of a country.
Equipment	Supplies or tools needed for a special purpose.
Vehicle	Something used to carry and move people or things.

Geography

Science link - know I am a human and I have an impact on the World
To know simple ways to look after the world.

History

To know that we remember the people who helped us in the past.

To say one thing that is the same/different between transport now and in the past.

PE

Jump off an object landing with 2 feet and knees bent
Move and stop safely
Identify and find personal space
Send an object: rolling, dribbling a ball (with hands and feet), underarm throw, pushing and kicking into / towards a large target
That in order to be safe, you need to have some distance between yourself and others
That rolling, throwing, pushing and kicking are all different ways in which an object can be moved
Demonstrate the overall body strength, coordination, balance and agility needed to engage successfully dance, gymnastics and sport.
Work and play co-operatively and take turns with a partner and group.
Follow rules and instructions in team games

Art

Choose from a range of materials and art resources, recyclable items, paint, paper for a purpose
Explore different methods of creating pattern, textures and shapes

Look at the work of an artist and say what they see
Say what they like or dislike about an artists work

Music

Sing/chant some songs/rhymes by heart
Perform sounds or actions in time to a pulse
Distinguish between high and low pitches
Starting to identify what sounds they can hear in the music
Using a range of rhythms when composing and performing

PSHE

Know what the word 'healthy' means
Know some things that they need to do to keep healthy
Know the names for some parts of their body
Know when and how to wash their hands properly
Know how to say no to strangers
Can explain what they need to do to stay healthy
Recognise how exercise makes them feel
Can give examples of healthy food
Can explain what to do if a stranger approaches them

RE

Know some of the signs of new life in spring such as flowers, eggs and baby animals
Know that Easter is a special time for Christians
Know that the cross is a special symbol for Christians

Science

Ask simple questions / Predict what will happen during play
Talk about what happened and start to use comparative terms
Understand the effect of changing seasons on the natural world around them.
To know and label four body parts (head, arms, legs, feet)
Choose and name some common materials to build with (wood, plastic, metal)

Computing

Know that some people can be unkind online

Communication and Language
- The children will be continuing to develop their language skills through play and interaction - They will be exposed to new books to support language development and new vocabulary - The children will use 'share and shine' to support development of spoken language
Phonics
- Please refer to the phonics overview for sounds taught - The children will continue to practice blending and segmenting - Please help your child by reading daily and completing home phonic book tasks
Maths
- Comparing and representing numbers to 10 - Combining two amounts to find a total - Learning number bonds to 5, then to 10 - Learning 3D shape, patterns and spatial awareness
Science
- The children will be learning about parts of the body - The children will review oral health and the impact this has - The children will perform a scientific experiment linked to materials
Art/ D.T
- Our artist of the half term is Arthur Schenning - In Art we will explore press printing and collage - In DT we will be exploring Easter card designs and designing a new form of transport
Music
- Sing/chant some songs/rhymes by heart - Perform sounds or actions in time to a pulse - Distinguish between high and low pitches
History
- The children will be learning about the history of transport and vehicles - Understand that photos are a way of showing what happened in the past - To say one thing that is the same/different between transport now and in the past
Geography
- The children will be looking at where local amenities are including: doctor surgeries, dentists, hospitals, vets - Linking to science, the children to know I have an impact on the world. - To know simple ways to look after the world

PSHE
- The children will be talking about healthy choices - They will think about how they can make better, healthier choices to enable them to achieve - This will link into our growth mindset teaching of helping others
RE
- Our topic this half term in Discovery RE is 'Easter' and the children will learn about the Easter story - Children will be looking at the theme of 'Salvation' in our Understanding Christianity teaching
PE
- The children will be developing skills within gymnastics for indoor PE and ball skills during outdoor PE - They will continue to learn how to dress themselves and take care of their belongings
Hook
We hope to have the fire service visiting! The fire service will talk about their job, bring in their uniform for us to try on and allow the children to explore the fire engine. (Fire engine depends on availability on the day—fingers crossed!)

The children will hopefully be visited by lots of emergency services and 'people who help us'. Fab finish final day = dress-up as someone who would help us in the community.
