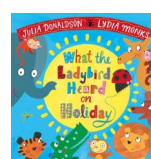
Our Country!

Vocabulary	Meaning
Local	a particular area or your neighbourhood
Area	a region or part of a town, a country, or the world
Town	a built-up area with a name, defined boundaries, and local government, it is larger than a village and generally smaller than a city
Village	a group of houses and associated buildings it is smaller than a town, situated in a rural area
City	a large town
Country	a large area of land that is distinct on a world map
Coast	the part of land near the sea
Royal	having the status of a king or queen or a member of their family

Art

Add detail to drawings which represent objects e.g. details on a face

Music

Begin to select instruments for purpose.
Listened and appreciated different styles of music.
Creating own music using different rhythms for each percussion instrument. Perform to a wider audience.

PSHE

Know the names and functions of some parts of the body
Know that we grow from baby to adult
Know who to talk to if they are feeling worried
Recognise that changing class can elicit happy and/or sad emotions
Can say how they feel about changing class/ growing up
Can explain what they need to do to stay healthy

RE

Know what a home is and what makes it special to me.
Know that Christians worship in a church

Science

Name and describe basic plants e.g. roots, petal, flower, stem
Know plants need water and sunlight to grow
Name and describe common animals e.g. dog, cat, cow, pig

Computing

Know what a sensible amount of screen time is
Be able to talk about how to stay safe on line (talk to teacher/trusted adult; not click on unknown things; not give name out)
To be able to give instructions to a program (e.g. bee bot)

Communication and Language
- The children will be continually developing their language skills through play and Interaction during 'Play to Learn' - They will be exposed to new books to support language development, including individual and group reads
Phonics
- Please refer to the weekly reminder for sounds and tricky words taught each week - The children will be learning Phase 5 sounds and continuing to practise blending and segmenting - Please help your child by reading daily and practising sounds and tricky words (reading and writing them in short sentences)
Maths
- We will be comparing and representing numbers beyond 10. Doubling to 10. - The children will be combining two amounts, comparing and learning number bonds to 10 - The children will be subtracting an amount from a bigger number
Science
- The children will be learning about weather and seasons - The children will be planting seeds/bulbs and helping them to grow - Children will find out about animals that live in our local area
Art / D.T
- Our artist of the half term is Nicky Phillips - In art we will explore portraits - In DT we will be exploring cooking scones
Music
- We will be continuing to use our 'Jolly Music' lessons - Suggested listening includes: The National Anthem
History
- The children will be learning about the Royal Family - They will learn about Jesse Owens as a key sports figure from the Olympic Games
Geography
- The children will be looking at where we live and local amenities - The children will be locating Poole on a map and other favourite places to visit - They will be looking at aerial photographs of Poole and local area - They will be learning about our country's rivers - We will be researching London and the Royal Family
